

## Covered Drugs for Dual Eligible Individuals

The following drugs continue to be covered by the Mississippi Division of Medicaid for dual eligible individuals. These drugs are subject to the same restrictions, limitations, and requirements for dual eligible individuals as they are for any Medicaid covered individual.

### **Barbiturates Covered (*only these barbiturates are covered for all Medicaid beneficiaries effective January 1, 2006.*)**

- Phenobarbital Sodium (Phenobarbital)
- Mephobarbital (Mebaral)

### **Benzodiazepines Covered (*only generic formulations are covered for all Medicaid beneficiaries effective January 1, 2006.*)**

- Alprazolam (*compares to Xanax*)
- Chlordiazepoxide (*compares to Librium*)
- Clonazepam (*compares to Klonopin*)
- Clorazepate Dipotassium (*compares to Tranxene*)
- Diazepam (*compares to Valium*)
- Estazolam (*compares to Dalmane*)
- Halazepam (*compares to Paxipam*)
- Lorazepam (*compares to Ativan*)
- Midazolam (*compares to Versed*)
- Oxazepam (*compares to Serax*)
- Quazepam (*compares to Doral*)
- Temazepam (*compares to Restoril*)
- Triazolam (*compares to Halcion*)

### **Over the Counter Formulary Medications -- *limited to DOM's OTC formulary (OTC insulin products are covered by Part D)***

#### **Other Products Covered**

- Cough and Cold preparations—limited to OTC formulary and benzonatate (compares to Tessalon)
- Prescription Vitamins
  - Vitamin K, Vitamin B12 injection, and Vitamin D (limited to ergocalciferol and cholecalciferol)
  - Prenatal vitamins
  - Some renal vitamins for dialysis pts
  - Folic Acid
  - Fluoride vitamins for beneficiaries under the age of 21
- Butalbital/acetaminophen or aspirin analgesic combinations (for example--Fiorcet or Fiorinal)
