

## PUBLIC NOTICE

Under the provisions of Title 42, Section 441.301(c)(6)(iii), of the Code of Federal Regulations, public notice is hereby given for the submission of a Transition Plan for Home and Community-Based Settings for the Division of Medicaid's 1915(c) Intellectual Disabilities/Developmental Disabilities (ID/DD) Waiver, which provides services as an alternative to institutionalization in an Intermediate Care Facility for Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities (ICF/IID).

1. The 1915(c) ID/DD Waiver transition plan for home and community-based settings is required as outlined by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) in 42 CFR § 441.301(c)(4). The purpose of the transition plan is to ensure Medicaid beneficiaries are receiving Home and Community-Based Services in settings that meet the quality requirements specified in the final rule and are appropriate based on the needs of the individual as indicated in their person-centered service plan. The final rule provides the Division of Medicaid the opportunity to develop a transition plan that encompasses a period of up to five (5) years after the effective date of the regulation to meet the provisions of the final rule.
