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DIRECTOR'S FORE WORD

Presented herewith is the report of the Mississippi Medicaid Commission for Fiscal Year 1974, the fourth full year of activity for the Medicaid Program. This report complies with the reporting requirements of Section 43-13-127 of the Mississippi Code of 1972 and, in addition, provides other information on the Program that might be of interest.

During this period, 275,314 persons received medical assistance through Medicaid at a total program cost of \$89,702,656. The services were provided by the State's health professionals, such as physicians, dentists, pharmacists, optometrists, hospitals, nursing homes and others.

Eligibility determinations continued to be made by the Department of Public Welfare during a difficult period brought on by implementation of the Federal Supplemental Security Income Program.

Claims processing and payment and certain other administrative functions continued to be performed by Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Mississippi, Inc., Fiscal Agent for the Medicaid Commission.

There has been during this period an increasing emphasis at the Federal level on provision of Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis and Treatment Services for Children. With the cooperation of the State Board of Health and the Department of Public Welfare, we, too, are adding emphasis to this service, which offers great potential for lasting benefit by finding and correcting abnormalities that might otherwise lead to permanent disability and continued dependence on public support.

Over 5.8 Million Dollars in Medicaid payments were made to other State health agencies and institutions during the year as the Commission staff continued to pur• ue the objective of securing maximum benefit from Federal funds under Medicaid, and thus stretching the State's health dollars as far as possible.

MISSISSIPPI'S MEDICAID PROGRAM

INTRODUCTION

Medicaid is a program of medical assistance for the needy administered by the states in accordance with provisions of Title XIX of the Social Security Act.

Mississippi began participation in Medicaid on January 1, 1970. The State's Medicaid Program is administered by the Mississippi Medicaid Commission, which was established by Section 7290-31 et. seq. of the Mississippi Code of 1942 (Recompiled). This law made the benefits of the Medicaid Program available to the following groups of needy persons:

Those qualified for public assistance grants under provisions of the following Titles of the Social Security Act as administered by Mississippi's State Department of Public Welfare:

Title I - - Old Age Assistance

Title IV - - Aid to Families with Dependent Children

Title X - - Aid to the Blind

Title XIV - - Aid to the Permanently and Totally Disabled;

Children in foster homes or private institutions for whom Mississippi public agencies are assuming financial responsibilty;

Children under twenty-one (21) years of age who, except for age or school attendance requirements, would be dependent children under the Aid to Families with Dependent Children Program (AFDC);

Persons who are patients in a medical facility and who, if they left such facility, would qualify for assistance (money) payments under Old Age Assistance, Aid to the Permanently and Totally Disabled, Aid to the Blind, or Aid to Families with Dependent Children Programs.

January 1, 1974, a Federal program of financial assistance to the Aged, Blind and Disabled, known as Supplemental Security Income (SSI), was imp'.emented. The new program was implemented under a restructured Title XVI which, in effect, abolished the Federal - State partnership in administering and financing the assistance programs under Titles I, X, and XIV which had existed since the passage of the Social Security Act in 1936. The Supplemental Security Income program is federally financed and administered by the Social Security Administration under provision of P.L. 92-603, or HR-1 as it is better known.

provisions of the new Title XVI effected the transfer of existing financial assistance programs for the Aged, Blind and Disabled from the State Department of Public Welfare in Mississippi to the Federal government.

The implementation of SSI greatly impacted the Medicaid eligibility determination. States have two basic options open to them in regard to determination of Medicaid eligibility. Medicaid eligibility may be extended to all persons receiving SSI benefits or the State may continue determining Medicaid eligibility by retaining its 1972 standard or any level up to the SSI standard. Mississippi chose to retain its 1972 standard.

The law further provides that a State which chooses to retain its 1972 standard must provide for a spend-down procedure for persons not meeting the income test of the 1972 standard. The spend-down provision is a procedure whereby an applicant, whose net income exceeds the income scale of the 1972 standard, may become eligible when he has 'spent down' or incurred expenses for medical services to the point at which his surplus or excess income has been depleted.

Health services covered under Medicaid in Mississippi are as follows:

Inpatient Hospital Services
Outpatient Hospital Services
Laboratory & X-Ray Services
Skilled Nursing Home Services
Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis and Treatment Services for Children
Physicians' Services
Home Health Services
Emergency Ambulance Services
Drug Services
Dental Services
Eyeglasses Necessitated by Eye Surgery
T.B. & Mental Institution Services
Intermediate Care Facility Services
Family Planning Services
Christian Science Sanatoria Care and Services

All covered services are subject to utilization controls and specific limitations. During Fiscal Year 1974, payments for all services, except Family Planning, were made with 80.55 percent Federal funds and 19.45 percent State funds. Family Planning payments were made with 90 percent Federal funds and 10 percent State funds. Federal financial participation in health services under Medicaid is established under a statutory formula which relates the per capita income of each state to the average per capita income for all states. The ceiling on Federal participation is 83 percent.

ADMINISTRATION


Regulations of Title XIX of the Social Security Act, the Federal Medicaid legislation, provide that each state shall receive Federal funds for 75 percent of the cost of professional staffing and related administrative costs, 100 percent of the cost of inspection of nursing home facilities, and 59 percent of other administrative costs, as shown in Figure 1. The total program expenditures repr• sent payments for health care services and program administration. Of the total expenditures of \$89,702,656, Federal funds amounted to \$70,822,407 or 79.0 percent of expenditures, while 21.0 percent or \$18,880,249 was State money, as shown in Figure 1.

Expenditures for administration of the Medicaid Program totaled \$4,614,792 or 5.1 percent of the total cost of the Program. This included all of the State agency cost, all cost of processing and i• aying claims by the Medicaid Fiscal Agent, Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Mississippi, Inc., and cost of determination of eligibility for the adult categories for the last half of the fiscal year under contract with the Department of Public Welfare.

Mississippi statutes assign responsibility for the determination of eligibility for the Medicaid Program to the State Department of Public Welfare. Prior to January 1, 1974, this was largely a by-product of the Welfare Department's regular work in processing applications for public assistance grants and there was little additional cost to the State, since Medicaid eligibility was automatic for those persons found eligible for a money payment. This is still true with respect to the Aid to Dependent Children category; however, Federal law and regulations•, as interpreted by the Regional Office of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, provide that after January 1, 1974, the State Department of Public Welfare can no longer draw Federal matching funds for the cost of determining eligibility for the adult categories for Medicaid, so this cost is now reflected in the Medicaid budget.

Section 249-B of P.L. 92-603 provides 100 percent Federal reimbursement of the cost of inspecting nursing homes to determine if such institutions comply with applicable health and safety standards.

In accordance with State law and Federal regulations for Title XIX, payment for services under Medicaid is always secondary to other third party liability. At the time of a recipient's admission to a hospital and at each of his visits to • doctor's office or other provider of service, a determination is made as to whether the recipient has third party coverage. Since Medicaid liability is always secondary, any third party payments up to the amount expended by Medicaid are required to be refunded to the Medicaid Program. A total of \$436,797 was collected in third party payments and was used to reduce the cost of medical services from \$85,524,660 to \$85,087,863.

ELIGIBLES

In the text of this report, the terra eligible refers to a person who has been certified by the Department of Public Welfare as having met the necessary requirements to receive Medicaid benefits.

The Department of Public Welfare received 55,102 applications for medical assistance during Fiscal Year 1974. A total of 30,813 applications was approved and 21,112 denied. At the end of the fiscal year, approximately 3,000 applications were pending.

During Fiscal Year 1974, the number of persons eligible to receive medical assistance increased at an average monthly rate of approximately 2,000 persons per month, increasing from 300,853 persons at the beginning of the fiscal year to 325,133 persons at the end of the year. This was an increase of 8.1 percent during the fiscal year. A monthly average of 311,564 persons was eligible for Medicaid benefits during Fiscal Year 1974.

The unduplicated count of persons eligible at some time during Fiscal Year 1974, was 358,138 different persons.

Table I shows the number of persons eligible by program category by month for Fiscal Year 1974.

RECIPIENTS

As the number of persons eligible to receive medical assistance increased, the number of persons who received one or more services (recipients) showed a corresponding increase. There was an increase of 8.1 percent in the monthly average number of recipients during Fiscal Year 1974. During the fiscal year, the number of recipients rose from 127,260 in July, 1973, to 137,515 in June, 1974. The monthly average number of recipients was 127,206. Increased utilization of health services by eligible children was responsible for the largest growth in the number of recipients. The unduplicated count of the total number of persons receiving one or more services at some time during Fiscal Year 1974, was 275,314 persons, or 76.9 percent of the total eligibles.

Table 2 shows the number of persons receiving one or more medical services by program category by month for Fiscal Year 1974.

UTILIZATION RATE

A utilization rate is determined by dividing the average number of recipients by the average number of eligibles. This percentage is indicative of the extent to which those per§0ns who are eligible to receive medical services actually utilize one or more services. Table 3 shows the monthly utilization rate for Fiscal Year 1974. The utilization rate was highest in the month of March when 43.7 percent of those eligible received one or more medical services. The average monthly utilization rate was 40.8 percent. This represents an increase of 2.6 percent over Fiscal Year 1973.

From the highest monthly rate to the lowest, the rates fluctuated within a range of less than 7 percent. These differences by month or season are due to expected chance variation and seasonal illnesses.

Table 4 is a comparison of yearly utilization rates by program category of eligibility. The utilization rate of all categories combined was 76.9 percent with persons in the adult categories using services more frequently than children. The greatest utilizers of rnedical assistance were the persons in the Aid to the Permanently and Totally Disabled category with a utilization rate of 90.7 percent.

PROGRAM INTEGRITY

The Program Integrity Unit increased the scope of its function as a "watchdog" of the Program. In addition to the requirement by State and Federal law to conduct periodic checks of provider records in order to verify receipt of service and to investigate cases suggestive of Program abuse or misuse, additional Federal regulations which became effective during the Spring of 1974 called for procedures to verify receipt of services for all types of providers through recipient contact. Verification procedures were established to select recipients at random and to verify that services were received, through the use of questionnaires and home interviews.

With the assistance of a sophisticated computerized Surveillance and Utilization Reporting System, the Commission is able to maintain practice and service profiles on all providers of service and on recipients who receive services through the Medicaid Program. These utilization profiles provide invaluable data which serve as keys to possible fraudulent activities or abuse of Program benefits and are a prime source of information upon which the Program Integrity Unit bases its investigations. An example of the type of profile information used is the frequency of physician visits for each recipient served during a specified time period. Exceptional reporting techniques are used to identify the unusual or exceptional profiles.

The results of any audit which reveals a significant irregularity are routinely reported to the Commission at its monthly meetings for a determination of any sanctions or punitive action against the provider or recipient. When the rendering of a service for which payment has been made cannot be verified through recipient contact and subsequent provider audit, the matter is referred to a staff review committee for disposition which may include referral to the Commission.

The Program Integrity Unit is also charged with the task of dealing with recipients who have received services during periods of time when they were not eligible to participate in the Program, either through error of the Agency determining eligibility or fraud on the part of the recipient.

During Fiscal Year 1974, the Program Integrity Unit conducted on-site audits of approximately 345 physician and dentist providers. The Drug Unit audited approximately 490 pharmacies. The Commission obtained refunds totaling \$18,025.27 from providers and placed one provider on probation. Recovery of \$17,011.62 was made from ineligible recipients.

The existence of the Program Integrity Unit continues to serve as an invaluable deterrent to potential fraud and abuse of benefits in the Medicaid Program. Activities in this area are continuing to expand to keep pace with the growth of the Program.

CLAIMS PAYMENTS

For Fiscal Year 1974, a total of 5,428,629 claims was received by the Medicaid Claims Department of Blue Cross-Blue Shield of Mississippi, Inc., Fiscal Agent for the Medicaid Program. This represents an increase of 939,569 claims or 20.9 percent over Fiscal Year 1973. Table 5 lists the number of claims received by month for each type of service covered under the M• dicaid Program for Fiscal Year 1974.

Based on recent Federal and State audits of the Medicaid Program, "clean" claims (those properly filed) are being paid within 15-30 days from date of receipt at the Medicaid claims office. There are, of course, exceptions to this where eligibility questions exist or where additional information may be needed, but these represent a very small percentage of the total.

The Commission's contract with Blue Cross-Blue Shield provides for reimbursement of administrative expenses based upon actual audited reasonable costs. Cost reimbursement principles used for this purpose are those established under the Medicare Program.

The fiscal agent contract operates on a yearly basis and monthly advances of administrative funds are made to Blue Cross-Blue Shield based upon a reasonable projection of administrative costs over the annual period. The monthly advances are subject to adjustment based upon actual cost experience.

Blue Cross-Blue Shield is a non-profit medical and hospital service corporation organized under the laws of the State of Mississippi. The company serves as the Federal Government's intermediaiy for Part A of Medicare, the hospital portion of the Civilian Health and Medical Program of the Uniformed Armed Services, and serves as one of the contractors for the Federal Employees Insurance Program. In addition, the company insures many other persons through its private business.

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EXPENDITURES

EXPENDITURES BY TYPE OF SERVICE

For the Fiscal Year beginning July 1, 1973, and ending June 30, 1974, total medical expenditures were \$85.1 M/Ilion. This was an increase of \$25.2 Million, or 44.5 percent above the amount spent for medical services in Fiscal Year 1973. This significant increase was due to a number of things: the increase in the number of eligibles, the coverage of Intermediate Care Facility Services and Family Planning Services for a full year, the increase in the Medicare deductible and certain Medicaid fee schedules, and the increase in the utilization of services.

Table 6 contains the absolute and relative distribution of medical service expenditures for Fiscal Year 1974 and for Fiscal Year 1973, shows the average spent per eligible for Fiscal Year 1974 and for Fiscal Year 1973, and shows the percentage increase or decrease of the 1974 medical service expenditures over the 1973 medical service expenditures for each type of service.

The medical service accounting for the largest program expenditure in Fiscal Year 1974 was Inpatient Hospital Services. During Fiscal Year 1973, the largest expenditure was also for Inpatient Hospital Service.

Skilled Nursing Facility Services was the second largest item in total payments provided for Medicaid eligible persons in both Fiscal Years 1974 and 1973.

Drugs remained third in total funds expended in Fiscal Year 1974. In Fiscal Year 1973 approximately \$.20 of each Medicaid service dollar was spent for drugs, while in Fiscal Year 1974 about \$.19 of each Medicaid service dollar was spent for drugs.

Expenditures for Physicians' Services ranked fourth in both fiscal years. The amount expended for the provision of Physicians' Services was about \$.17 of each service dollar for both fiscal years.

The relative distribution of the Medicaid service dollar was approximately the same in both fiscal years for the remainder of the medical services.

The average spent per eligible person showed an increase of 34.7 percent from an average of \$202.71 per eligible person spent in Fiscal Year 1973 to an average of \$273.10 per eligible person in Fiscal Year 1974.

EXPENDITURES BY PROGRAM CATEGORY OF ELIGIBILITY

Table 7 illustrates the absolute and relative distribution of medical service expenditures and the average spent per eligible person by program category of eligibility.

Two of the program categories, Old Age Assistance and Aid to the Permanently and Totally Disabled, accounted for 72.3 percent of the total expenditures for medical service. The expenditures incurred on behalf of the persons eligible under the Aid to the Permanently and Totally Disabled program category averaged \$610.57 per eligible for Fiscal Year 1974 and the expenditures incurred on behalf of the persons eligible under the Old Age Assistance program category averaged \$512.65 per eligible.


While the Aid to Families with Dependent Children program category represented the largest percentage of eligibles, the expenditures per person were relatively low. The persons covered under the Aid to the Blind program category represent approximately I percent of the total eligibles and the expenditures attributable to the Aid to the Blind program category were approximately 1 percent of the total amount spent for medical services in Fiscal Year 1974.

PAYMENTS MADE TO STATE HEALTH AGENCIES AND INSTITUTIONS

State health agencies and institutions received \$5,895,178 for services provided to Medicaid eligibles during the fiscal year. The Medicaid staff has worked closely with all State health agencies toward reaching the objectives of fiscal coordination intended under the Medical Assistance Act. The amounts paid to individual agencies and institutions are shown in Table 8.

SER VICES

PHYSICIANS' SERVICF.•

For the period beginning July 1, 1973, and ending June 30, 1974, Medicaid expenditures for Physicians' Services totaled \$14,277,985. In addition \$6,663,912 was paid for Part B Premiums under Medicare for those Medicaid eligibles who are also eligible for Medicare. The greatest expenditure was for payments made on behalf of Old Age Assistance recipients. Of the \$14 Million expended for Physicians' Services, \$4,394,126 was spent for services rendered to recipients in the Old Age Assistance category. This was largely deductible and coinsurance payments under Part B of Medicare. The amount of expenditures by program category is shown on Table 9 below.

When the persons over 64 years of age who are caretaker relatives and covered under the Aid to Families with Dependent Children program category are added to those above, the total expenditures for persons 65 years and over becomes \$4,597,070 and represents 32.2 percent of the total expenditures for Physicians' Services. The distribution of expenditures by age groups is shown in Table 10. The age group 21-64 years includes those persons covered under Aid to the Blind, Aid to the Permanently and Totally Disabled, and adult caretakers in the Aid to Families with Dependent Children categories.

The Mississippi Medicaid Commission pays the premium for Part B of Medicare plus the Part B coinsurance and deductibles for eligible persons who meet the requirements of the Social Secur• ty Administration. The amount paid by Medicai.• for *coinsurance* and deductibles under Physicians' Services provided through Part B of Medicare totaled \$4,597,070. Of the total, \$2,654,582 was for deductibles and \$1,942,488 for coinsurance.

A total of 229,602 persons received one or more Physicians' Services. The largest number of recipients of Physicians' Services was in the Aid to Families with Dependent Children category, with 100,690 children receiving one or more services. Although this group did have the greatest number of users, it had the lowest utilization rate. Percentage-wise, the largest group of utilizers of Physicians' Services was the Aid to the Permanently and Totally Disabled category, with a utilization rate of 84.8 percent. The overall utilization rate of Physicians' Services for all categories was 73.7 percent. Table 11 shows the utilization rates by category.

A total of 953,700 visits was made to physicians by the 229,602 recipients.

Since only coinsurance and deductibles are paid for the majority of visits made by persons in the Old Age Assistance category, this category has been omitted from Table 12.

The 928,102 visits made by 160,897 persons in the other categories represent an average of 5.8 visits per recipient. Persons in the adu,t categories used Physicians' Services much more frequently than children. The range of average visits per recipient was from 3.7 visits per recipient for the Aid to Families with Dependent Children to 11.7 visits per recipient for the Aid to the Permanently and Totally Disabled category. Table 12 shows the distribution of average visits per recipient by program category.

During Fiscal Year 1974 the average monthly caseload for the four categories above was 226,418 eligib'.e persons. Relating the 928,102 physicians' visits to the persons eligible, represents an average of 4.1 visits per eligible. The relative distribution among categories remained the same; with the members of the Aid to the Permanently and Totally Disabled category making the highest number of visits per eligible, averaging 9.9 visits per eligible and those in the Aid to Families with Dependent Children category making the least number of visits per e• igible, averaging 2.4 visits per eligible. Table 13 shows the number of physicians' visits by program category.

By place of service, the largest number of physicians' visits was office visits. There were 732,047 office visits, representing 76.8 percent of the total physicians' visits. The distribution of physicians' visits by place of service is shown on Table 14.

A total of 2,039 physicians participated in the Medicaid Program during this period, includlng 470 out-of-state physicians. The largest specialty group was the Family Physicians, representing almost half of the total.

Medical services rendered or ordered by these physicians for 254,363 Medicaid recipients included:

INPATIENT HOSPITAL SERVICES

During Fiscal Year 1974, there were 43,571 hospital discharges with 258,301 days of inpatient hospital care covered by Medicaid. The average length of stay was 5.9 days. For the relatively small number of persons covered under Old Age Assistance category who do not qualify for Part A of Medicare, Medicaid pays for their hospital services. These persons had a much longer average length of stay than did persons covered under the other four categories. The average length of stay for Old Age Assistance recipients was 8.8 days. Children had the shortest average length of stay, with an average of 4.4 days. Table 15 below shows the average length of stay for Inpatient Hospital Services by program category.

A total of 168 hospitals participated in the Medicaid Program during Fiscal Year 1974. Of this total, 117 were located in Mississippi and 51 were out-cf-state hospitals. Also included in this total was the Mississippi State Sanatorium where]6 persons 65 years of age and over received services.

Most of the persons 65 years of age and over have inpatient hospital coverage under Part A of Medicare. For these persons, Medicaid paid the hospital deductible. A total of \$2,114,215 was paid for deductibles under Part A of Medicare for these persons.

The persons eligible received an average of 12.0 prescriptions for Fiscal Year 1974. The relative distribution remained approximately the same; with the members of the Aid to the Permanently and Tota:ly Disabled category receiving the highest number of prescriptions per eligible, averaging 26.9 per eligible and children in the Aid to Families with Dependent Children category receiving the lowest number of prescriptions per eligible, averaging 3.0 prescriptions per eligible.

A comparison of the average number of prescriptions by category for Fiscal Year 1974 with the average number of prescriptions by category for Fiscal Year 1973, in Table 17, shows a slight increase in utilization among most categories.

,During Fiscal Year 1974, approximately .75 'l. .rcent of tho. e eligible received one or more prescriptions, showing this service to be the one used by the largest number of eligibles.

NURSING FACILITY SERVICES

Under the Skilled Nursing Facility Services, 6,979 lcersons received care during Fiscal Year 1974. Of these, 6,226, or 89.2 percent, were age 65 or older. In addition to the elderly, 27 blind persons, 642 disabled 1• ersons, 80 children and 4 adults in the Aid to Families with Dependent Children Program received skilled nursing care. A total of 1,672,380 d-• ys of care was provided at a cost of \$19,741,556, which represents an average payment of \$11.80 per day. These payments do not include covered drugs, medical supplies, or physicians' services, as these are paid for under other covered services.

Under the Intermediate Care Facility Services. 1,549 persons received care. Of these, 1,362, or 87.9 percent, were age 65 years or older. In addition to the elderly, 7 blind persons, 177 disabled persons, 2 children and I adult in the Aid to Families with Dependent Children Program received intermediate nursing care. A total of 386,182 days of care was provided at a cost of \$4,099,665, which represents an average payment of \$10.62 per day.

All persons with an income who are admitted to a nursing home are allowed to keep \$41.50 per month for personal needs. Any income above this amount is applied to the nursing home bill

and a like amount is deducted from the Medicaid payment to the home. The nursing home collects this money directly from the patient, the family, or the sponsor.

As of June 30, 1974, there were 93 skilled homes, 28 intermediate homes and 9 out-of-state homes participating in the Medicaid Program.

Prior authorization is required for admission as a Medicaid patient to any nursing home participating in the program. Each application is evaluated by • Medicaid staff physician who determines if the patient is in need of skilled or inte,rmedia• e nursing home care. There were 5,087 prior authorization forms received by the Medicaid Commission with 4,889 being approved and 198 being disapproved for the skilled level of care. Two hundred thirty-eight (238) applications were received for intermediate care during Fiscal Year 1974.

After placement in a nursing home, a medical review team, which is composed of a doctor, registered nurse and a social worker, sees each patient and reviews the patient's record at least once a year. The purpose of medical review is to determine whether or not the patient continues to need the skilled level of care and, if so, whether or not the patient is actually receiving skilled nursing care

OUTPATIENT HOSPITAL SERVICES

A total of 104,792 outpatient hospital visits was provided to 54,223 recipients. These visits were made to 159 different hospitals at an average cost of \$11.89 per visit and represented an average of 1.9 visits per recipient.

DENTAL SERVICES

Limited dental care was provided to 38,820 persons during Fiscal Year 1974. A total of 134,991 dental procedures (mainly extractions) was provided at an average cost of \$6.13 per procedure.

A total of 371 dentists participated in the program during Fiscal Year 1974. In addition to the limited dental care provided under Dental Services, approximately 3,000 children were provided supplemental dental care under the Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis and Treatment Services.

EARLY AND PERIODIC SCREENING, DIAGNOSIS AND TREATMENT SERVICES

The State Board of Health, in cooperation with local health departments, screens children eligible for Medicaid. Children requiring follow-up services are referred to an appropriate facility or practitioner for diagnosis and treatment.

During Fiscal Year 1974, a total of 30,420 children was screened. Among those screened, 6,834 children indicated they had never had a physical examination before. The most frequent abnormal condition found during the screening was multiple caries. A total of 14,559 children was reported with this condition. Other abnormal conditions found frequently included enlarged or infected tonsils, intestinal parasites, ear infections, impetigo and abnormal heart sounds.

Effective July 1, 1972, the Mississippi Medicaid Program's EPSDT Service was expanded to provide supplemental Medicaid services for correction and/or treatment of certain health deficiencies found during the screening process. These services are in addition to the amount, duration,

and scope of coverage provided otherwise under the State Plan. Follow-up is routinely done by *per*-sonnel of the local health and welfare departments, v.sin• computer printouts furnished monthly by the Medicaid Commission. These computer printouts are derived from claims payment information.

For Fiscal Year 1974, supplemental coverage fol' eyeglasses, hearing aids and dental care was extended to all Medicaid screened children. Under' the provision of these supplemental services, approximately 3,000 children received restorative dental treatment, over 2,000 children received eyeglasses, and 45 children received hearing aids.

Expenditures for the three supplemental EPSDT Services totaled \$202,524 roi' Fiscal Year 1974.

FAMILY PLANNING SERVICES

July 1, 1974, Family Planning Services became a separate covered service fol' Medicaid. Section 299-E of Public Law 92-603 provides 90 percent Federal matching under Title XIX for expenditures attributable to offering, arranging and furnishing such services and supplies. Reimbursement can be made to private physicians, family planning clinics, or pharmacies.

During Fiscal Year 1974, a total of 9,737 persons received family planning medical services and 13,420 persons received family planning drugs.

A total of \$382,951 was expended for Family Planning Services.

COUNTY DATA

Table 18 is a presentation of the numbers of eligibles and recipients and the Medicaid expenditures by county on the basis of the residence of the recJlaient for Fiscal Year 1974.

The expenditures vary from a low of \$141,831 for Issaquena County where only 674 persons were eligible to a high of \$6.6 Million for Hinds where 31,164 persons were eligible.

A comparison of the number of persons eligible for medical assistance with the total population by county, as given in the Estimates of Population of Mississippi Counties: July 1973, is shown on Table 18. While 14.2 percent of the State population was eligible for Medicaid, county percentages varied from a high of 35.8 percent for Holmes County to a low of 3.6 percent for Jackson County.
